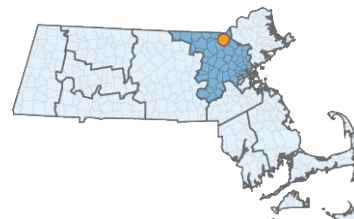


Lowell (Middlesex)

Lowell is a city in Middlesex County with 13,301 residents aged 65 and older. Compared to state average rates, older residents in Lowell report lower rates of atrial fibrillation, benign prostatic hyperplasia, breast cancer, cataract, fibromyalgia/chronic pain/fatigue, osteoarthritis/rheumatoid arthritis, osteoporosis, and prostate cancer. However, they report higher rates of tooth loss, anemia, chronic kidney disease, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), congestive heart failure (CHF), diabetes, hypertension, ischemic heart disease, liver disease, peripheral vascular disease, stroke, substance and tobacco use disorders, depression, anxiety disorder, PTSD, schizophrenia, and high cholesterol. Older Lowell residents are less likely to take the health promotion step of receiving a pneumonia vaccine. Community resources to support healthy aging include three adult day health centers, five community health centers, a COA, three home health agencies, a hospital, two public libraries, 103 primary care providers, seven skilled nursing facilities, one assisted living facility, and two public universities or community colleges.

TECHNICAL NOTES

*For more information on data sources, measures, and methodology used in the 2025 Massachusetts Healthy Aging Data Report see our technical documentation at (healthyagingdatareports.org). For most indicators, the community and state values are estimates derived from sample data. Thus, it is possible that some of the differences between state and community estimates may be due to chance associated with population sampling. We use the terms “Better” and “Worse” to highlight differences between community and state estimates that we are confident are not due to chance. We balance two goals. First, we aim to report data at very local levels because we believe change is often locally driven. Second, we vowed to protect the privacy of the people providing the information reported. Thus, given the constraints of the data analyzed, we used a hierarchical approach to reporting.
